Who can apply?

Due to the high number of students that apply, candidates will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Must be a resident of Canada
- Must be a high school student in grade 11 or 12 (or CEGP equivalent)
- Must be 16 years of age by January 1st of the year of participation
- Must have a high academic standing (overall GPA of 85% or higher)
- Must show an interest in pursuing a career/ education in human genetics
- Must be well rounded in all areas (academic, volunteer and extra-curricular activities)
- Must complete application form and submit all required documentation by deadline

When is the application deadline?

Applications are accepted from November 1st thru December 31st

How can I apply?

How many students are accepted?

The number of students selected each year depends on how many lab placements are available; typically it is between 40 and 50 students each year.

Is there a cost to participate?

There is no cost to participate or apply for the program unless you are required to travel and then there may be some costs (see below)

When are the placements?

Each placement is for one week. We orchestrate placements to coincide with each student's own scheduled spring break at their school so that there are no missed classes as a result of the placement.

Will I be placed in a lab in my home city/town?

We do our best to place students as close to home as possible. However, placements are based on many factors and up to 35% of our students will be required to travel. Placements can be anywhere in Canada.

Will I have to pay for my travel?

Each year the Canadian Gene Cure Foundation raises funds through grants as well as corporate and private donations to support the program. These funds allow us to provide students a travel grant where required. Travel grant amounts are dependent upon funds raised as well as the number of students requiring travel.

Will there be other students in my lab?

Most labs can accommodate either one or two students however it does depend on their own staffing availability at the time of placement. We cannot guarantee that you will be placed with another student.
